

## Neston Foodbank Distribution Centre

Today in the UK 1 in 5 people are living below the poverty line. Neston & District Churches Together & local community leaders investigated the need for a Distribution Centre in Neston & found there was a real need. A Distribution Centre with trained volunteers has now opened at the Parish Church under the West Cheshire Foodbank which is affiliated to the Trussel Trust. Many Churches & Sainsburys collect donated food which goes to the warehouse in Ellesmere Port for sorting before going to the Distribution Centres. People in need, mainly due to benefit delays, can go to a Distribution Centre after first being assessed & given vouchers for 3 days food. Neston Food Vouchers can now be obtained from venues in Neston. (The Childrens Centre, Age UK at Neston Methodist Church & the Library-see posters) Many thanks for all your food donations.
